Dear Parent/Caregiver

This is a letter to invite you to a **Parent Information & Meet the Teacher Evening** next week at **7:30pm on Wednesday the 10th February**, and to outline the start of the year for Year 10.

It has been a good beginning to the 2016 school year for our Year 10 students and, as expected, they have settled back into the many different routines at Gladstone High School very well. As we have a reasonably small Year 10 cohort this year, students are all in the same home group and will have all of their core subjects together. They will be divided into practical subjects such as Visual Arts, Agricultural Studies, Digital Media and Technological Studies based on their subject choices made at the end of last year.

So far this year, home group teacher Mr Daniel Seidel (1016) has been working with students developing relationship and organisational skills while re-acquainting them with our school rules. Home group teachers are particularly important people for both students and their parents, as they undertake the majority of the administrative tasks, but most importantly they are the first teacher that your child works with each morning. Students have 20 minutes each day for home group and Lesson 1 on Wednesday and Friday mornings are set aside for Pastoral Care. Part of the focus of Pastoral Care so far has been on the students being organised, using their diary and developing a positive learning culture within the classrooms.

As a parent you can support the home group teacher and the school in the following ways;

- Ensure your child attends school every day
- Check your child/children's diary for any notes
- Complete an absent slip if your child is away for any particular reason (this can be done prior to the absence)
- Support the school dress code (which can be found in the front of the diary)
- Support the school behaviour code
- Check for and help your child/children with their homework
- Sign and check your child/children's diary at the end of each week
- Maintain good contact with the school

Year 10 students should be expecting to get up to 100 minutes homework per night (approximately 30 minutes per 3 subjects) as highlighted on the homework timetable in your student's diary. Some teachers may set a weekly task whilst others may set homework on a daily basis. Sometimes there are assignments which have a due date in a number of weeks and this could be the homework for that night if none is specifically set.



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These planning and organisational skills can be very difficult to teach and it is only with your help to reinforce these skills that we can be successful. Help your child/children to plan for long term deadlines by setting short term goals with their work.

Homework should be entered into each student's diary by the student, therefore you should be able to monitor what your child/children have to complete. Maintaining their diary is the student's responsibility and this will be monitored by the school and you. If this is not occurring, challenge your child/children and if there are no improvements please contact me at the school. In addition, students will be given a topic outline which for each subject, which contains information about activities and assessment they will be studying. This should be placed in their written work book for each subject. If you need further copies of these please contact the relevant subject teacher.
