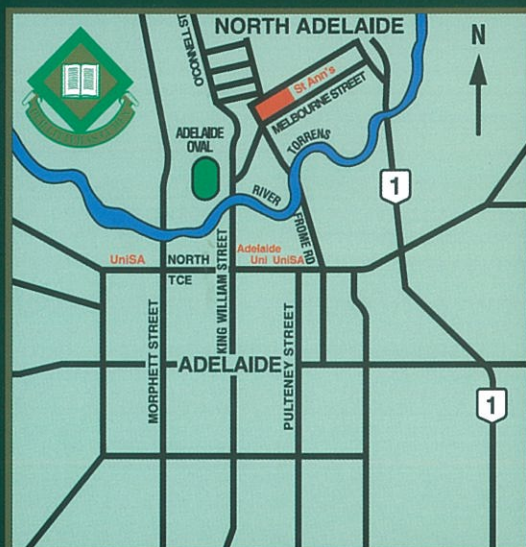

Introduction

St Ann's College provides an inspiring environment where opportunities for education, broadly understood, are promoted. Students from diverse backgrounds are encouraged to contribute to a happy social atmosphere where they can realise their full potential. The development of judgement, personal responsibility and consideration for others are high priorities. Our academic record is outstanding.

History

Established in 1939 and affiliated with the University of Adelaide as a non-denominational university college for women, St Ann's College opened to students in 1947. In 1973 the Council decided that the College should be co-residential; there are now 185 students of any gender, from rural and regional Australia, interstate and overseas. There has always been a highly innovative and entrepreneurial focus.

The original property at 187 Brougham Place was bequeathed by Mr Sidney Wilcox. The adjoining premises at 191 Brougham Place and on Melbourne Street were later acquired and a spacious dining hall and common room built in 1961, named in recognition of the service to the College of Dr Helen Mayo. Following the 2001-4 construction of the Dame Roma Mitchell Building and major refurbishments, most student rooms have an ensuite bathroom and all have high-speed internet access and reverse-cycle air conditioning.

College Community

The safety and security of students are top priorities, along with student health and wellbeing. St Ann's is an international community inspired to excellence through learning. It encourages high academic achievement within a supportive family atmosphere. Highly trained residential tutors provide academic and social leadership and pastoral care 24/7. The Principal lives on site. Academic tutors help with study and serve as mentors. Tutorial guidance is available in sixty subjects. As students' families live at some distance from Adelaide, every effort is made to ensure high levels of security and communication. There are many leadership, sporting and social opportunities. Outstanding former students and guests offer inspirational mentoring.

Facilities

Three high-quality delicious meals are provided daily and rooms cleaned weekly. Each student has a single study bedroom furnished with a bed, telephone, wardrobe, bookshelf, desk, desk lamp and air conditioner. All rooms have unlimited high-speed internet access and two-thirds have an ensuite bathroom. The College has a new high-tech Enterprise Deck for student collaborative study, a fine library attuned to undergraduate needs, a computer room linked to the universities, tutorial rooms and a well-equipped design room, weights room, photographic studio and music rooms with pianos including two baby grand pianos. There are common rooms, laundries, and kitchens for the preparation of snacks. Situated in spacious gardens with a tennis court, the College has billiard and table tennis tables as well as TV and video rooms.

Who

The College provides a room and full board for university students, both undergraduate and postgraduate. Two universities are within walking distance.

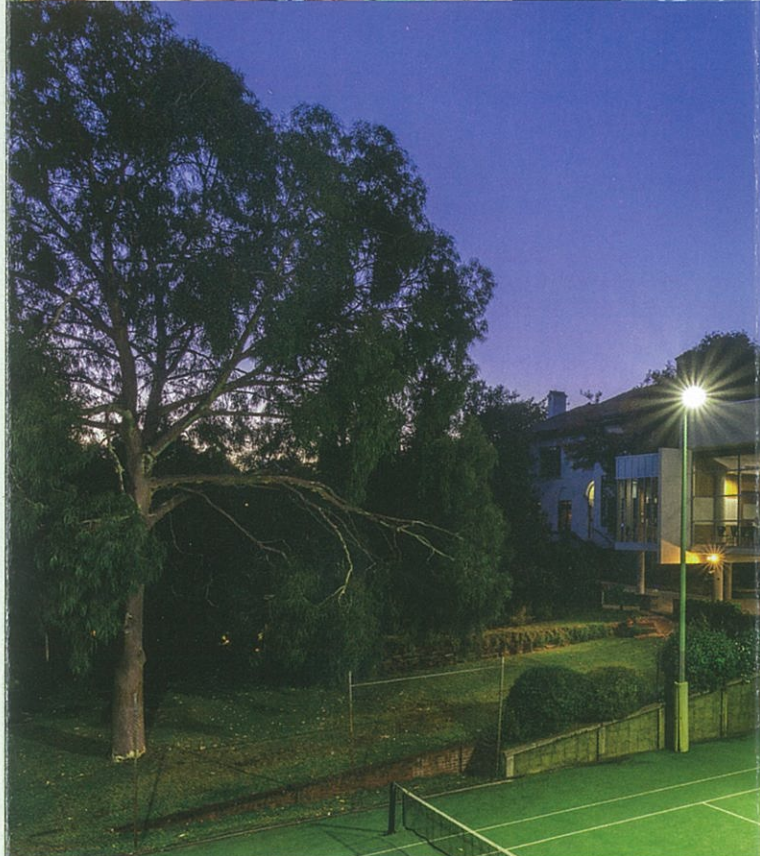
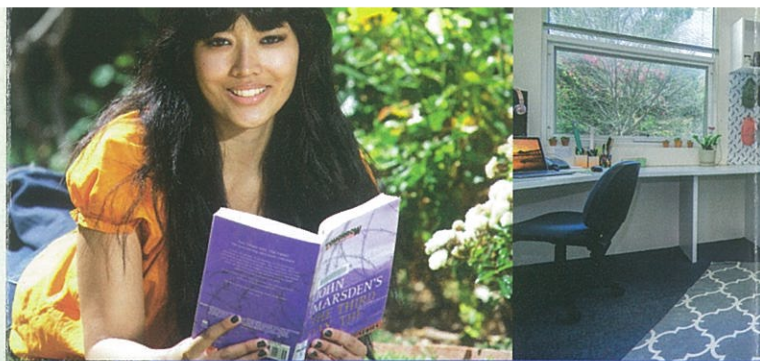
Before coming into residence students must sign an undertaking to abide by College regulations. No student is permitted to remain in College unless the Principal is satisfied with the student's academic progress and conduct.

The Council reserves the right to exclude students following non-payment of fees.

Students are required to commit to remaining in residence for thirty weeks of the academic year.

All students are required to be members of the College Club, which charges an annual fee and plays a vital role in student life.

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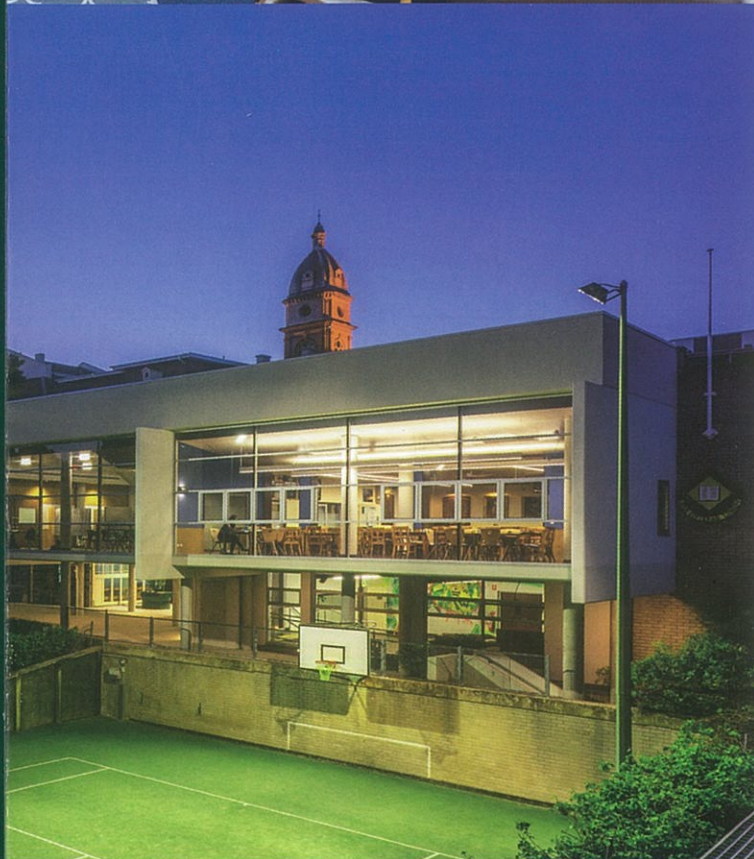
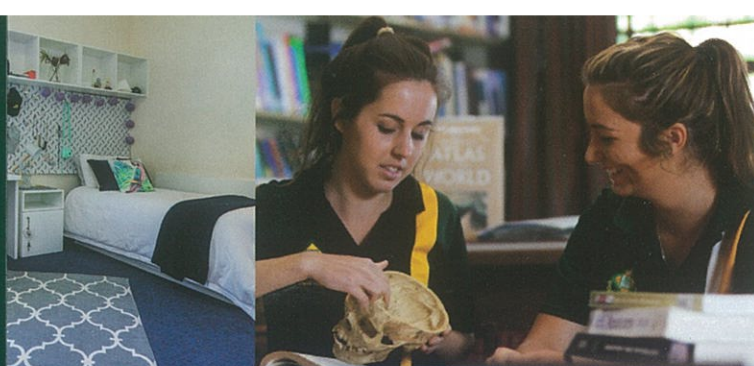
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What to Bring

The College year officially begins with University Orientation Week, when College Club organises various welcoming activities.

Vacations

During vacations the College accommodates visitors to University and community conferences for additional income to subsidise student fees. While students in residence have first call on their rooms, if they are absent during vacations it is expected that rooms will be left tidy and private for conference visitors. Rooms do not have to be packed up entirely; there is a lockable cupboard for valuable items.

Scholarships and Bursaries

Significant numbers of scholarships and bursaries are awarded annually to first-year and continuing students on the basis of both academic merit and financial need.
